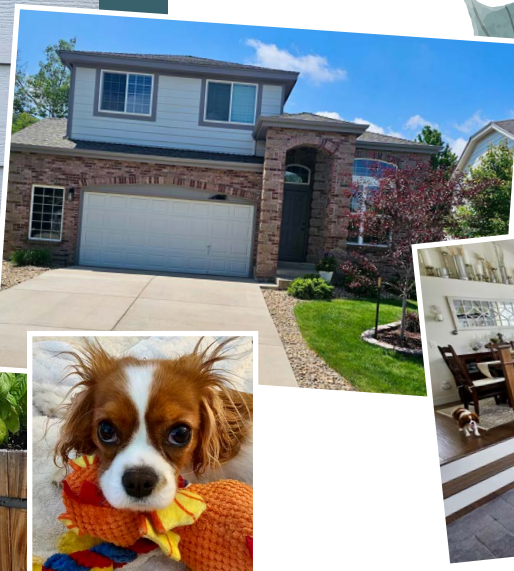
MY STORY
