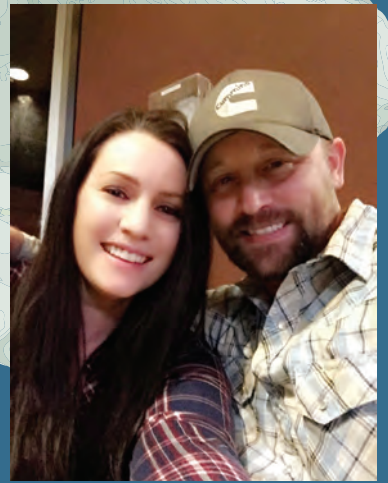
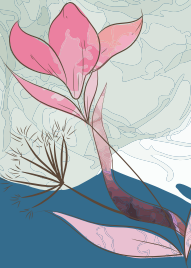


WHAT LED US TO ADOPTION
