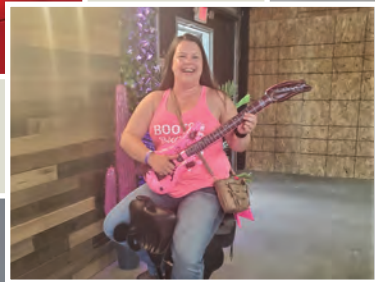


what led me to adoption

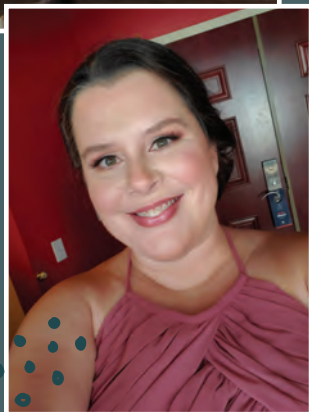
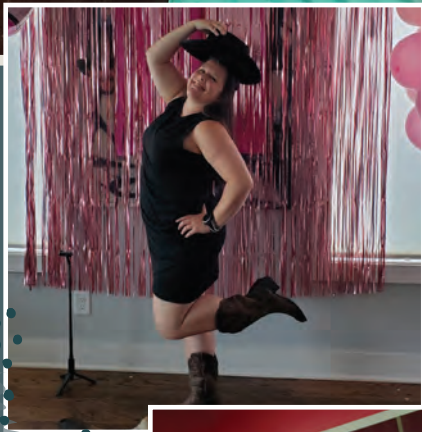

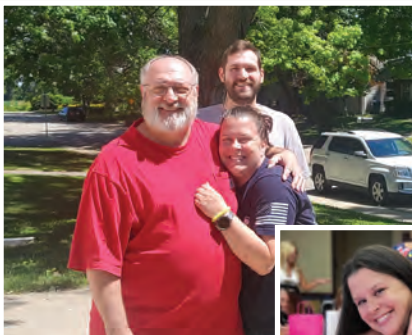
